About the AIHREA Summer Internship Program:

The American Indian Health Research & Education Alliance (AIHREA) is currently accepting applications for the 2016 AIHREA Summer Internship Program. Undergraduate and graduate students who are highly motivated to work with American Indian people are encouraged to apply.

The AIHREA Summer Internship Program provides interns with hands-on experience working on research projects addressing health issues and education among American Indian communities. Interns will be paired with a faculty/staff mentor for the duration of the 8-week program.

This is a paid internship position with interns working 40 hours per week for 8 weeks. Interns will be paid a \$1,800 stipend each month. Interns will spend a week in Eagle Butte, South Dakota, working with youth and community members on the Cheyenne River Sioux Reservation.

Internship Requirements:

- Program dates: June 6, 2016 – July 29, 2016
- Must be in good academic standing (Minimum GPA of 2.5)
- Complete the on-line application
- Copy of unofficial transcript(s)
- Two letters of reference
 - One letter from a faculty member at your school
 - The second letter may be from a faculty member, tribal official, or tribal leader
- One essay on a health topic affecting American Indians (1,000 words)
